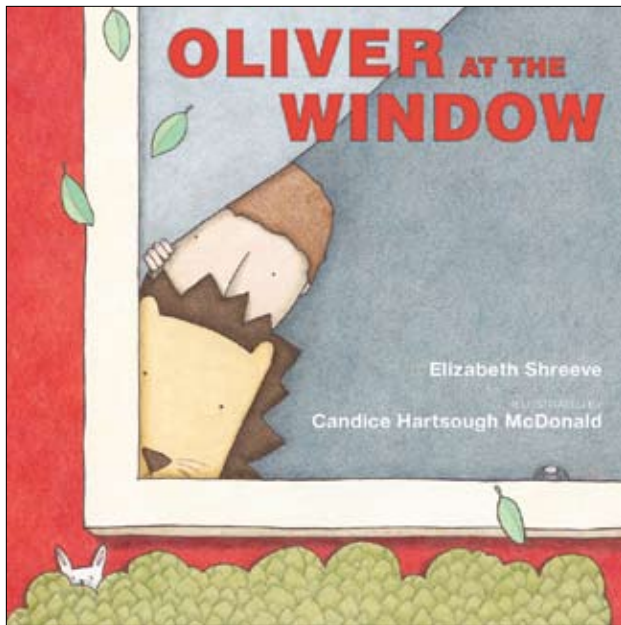


ELIZABETH SHREEVE *Oliver at the Window*
